ANNOUNCING "MANAGING PAIN AND OPIOID USE: AN EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM ON COMPLIANCE WITH NYS PRESCRIBING LAWS."

Introduction:

The use of prescription and non-prescription opioids has dramatically increased in New York State. Healthcare providers who prescribe opioid analgesics must understand and demonstrate ongoing knowledge of pain management, palliative care, and addiction.

NYACP, in collaboration with Boston University School of Medicine, is providing this course in response to NYS Public Health Law Section 3309-A, enacted in 2016, which requires professionals licensed under Title 8 of the NYS Education Law with a valid DEA number and every medical resident prescribing under a hospital or facility DEA number to complete a 3-hour training course covering the following specific elements:

- 1. State and Federal laws on the prescribing of controlled substances
- 2. Pain Management
- 3. Appropriate Prescribing
- 4. Managing Acute Pain
- 5. Palliative Medicine
- 6. Prevention/Screening/Signs of Addiction
- 7. Responses to Abuse and Addiction
- 8. End of Life Care

The course is designed in three modules. The first two modules are the highly acclaimed Boston University School of Medicine Safe and Competent Opioid Prescribing Education (SCOPE) Course. The 3rd module contains the elements required by the New York State law not covered in the SCOPE course.

What You Need to Know:

- Target Audience: Physicians, nurse practitioners, residents, registered nurses, nurses, physician assistants, dentists, and pharmacists
- CME/MOC: The NYACP/BU educational activity will offer participants 3 Hours of AMA PRA Category 1
 CreditsTM in addition to 3 MOC points through the American Board of Internal Medicine's (ABIM)
 Maintenance of Certification (MOC) program.
- Course must be completed by 7/1/17 and every 3 years thereafter
- If you are <u>licensed on or after 7/1/17</u>, you must complete training <u>within 1 year</u> of receipt of your license and every three years thereafter
- Training must be completed every 3 years thereafter

- For Residents prescribing under a hospital or facility DEA number:
 - Current residents must complete mandatory training by 7/1/17 and every 3 years thereafter
 - Residents <u>beginning work on or after 7/1/17</u> must complete the course <u>within 1 year</u> of the start of their residency and every three years thereafter
 - Hospitals must attest that ALL residents prescribing under their institutional DEA number have completed the required training
- The course is FREE

<u>Courses Acceptable to the Department of Health:</u> The Department of Health has indicated that any course accredited for continuing education by any organization serving professionals licensed under title eight of the education law to treat humans and registered under the federal controlled substances act and in possession of a DEA registration number, and every medical resident who is prescribing under a facility DEA registration number shall satisfy the requirement as long as the course content meets all 8 topical requirements under the statute, and is at least three hours in length (see the course content section).

For physicians, nurses and other allied health professionals, this means that the NYACP/BU CME/MOC accreditation meets this requirement.

Attestation: Every professional required to take the mandated course will be required to attest to the Department of Health that they have satisfied three hours of coursework or training covering the 8 course content elements on or before July 1, 2017. Please maintain your certificate of course completion in your files. The process and forms for attestation will be announced by the Department of Health shortly, and the Chapter will share the process for reporting to DOH as soon as it is available.
